

## What are Pronouns?

- Pronouns are words like she, he, or they. For example:
  - "Her chart is ready."
    - "Her" is the pronoun in this sentence.
  - "He is picking up a chart."
    - "He" is the pronoun in this sentence.
- While many people have "she" or "he" pronouns in English, some people have less binary pronouns, such as singular "they" or "ze."
- Some people don't have any pronouns at all, and just use their names instead, and some people have more than one type of pronoun, such as "she/they."

## Using Pronouns in a Sentence:

- She/Her/Hers
  - **She** is picking up a chart.
  - **Her** chart is ready now.
  - That chart is hers.
- They/Them/Theirs (singular usage)
  - **They** are picking up a chart.
  - **Their** chart is ready now.
  - That chart belongs to them.
- He/Him/His
  - **He** is picking up a chart.

- **His** chart is ready now.
- That chart belongs to **him**.
- Ze/Hir/Hirs
  - **Ze** is picking up a chart.
  - Hir chart is ready now.
  - That chart is hirs.
- No Pronouns
  - [Name] is picking up a chart.
  - [Name's] chart is ready now.
  - That chart is [Name's].
