



What are Pronouns?

- Pronouns are words like she, he, or they. For example:
 - “Her chart is ready.”
 - “**Her**” is the pronoun in this sentence.
 - “He is picking up a chart.”
 - “**He**” is the pronoun in this sentence.
- While many people have “**she**” or “**he**” pronouns in English, some people have less binary pronouns, such as singular “**they**” or “**ze.**”
- Some people don’t have any pronouns at all, and just use their names instead, and some people have more than one type of pronoun, such as “**she/they.**”



Using Pronouns in a Sentence:

- **She/Her/Hers**
 - **She** is picking up a chart.
 - **Her** chart is ready now.
 - That chart is **hers**.
- **They/Them/Theirs** (singular usage)
 - **They** are picking up a chart.
 - **Their** chart is ready now.
 - That chart belongs to **them**.
- **He/Him/His**
 - **He** is picking up a chart.
 - **His** chart is ready now.
 - That chart belongs to **him**.
- **Ze/Hir/Hirs**
 - **Ze** is picking up a chart.
 - **Hir** chart is ready now.
 - That chart is **hirs**.
- **No Pronouns**
 - **[Name]** is picking up a chart.
 - **[Name's]** chart is ready now.
 - That chart is **[Name's]**.
